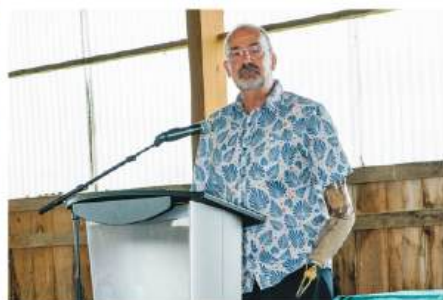
CELEBRATE SUNRISE! June 22, 2025

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN PROJECT

"Village at Sunrise Farm"

On September 17th, the Puslinch Township Council passed a resolution to recommend to the County of Wellington that \$800,000 of the \$1 million Puslinch portion of the County Housing Fund be allocated to **Sunrise** towards the affordable supportive housing portion of the proposed new building "Village at Sunrise Farm". Approval by Wellington County will mean this would be the single largest contribution to the project to date; and will be a welcome and significant step forward. Longtime dedicated supporters have stepped up with one-time and multi-year capital donations- approval by Wellington County will push us towards the millions of dollars now needed to complete the project... stay tuned!
