PROVINCIAL MINISTER TODD SMITH VISITS SUNRISE

The Hon. Todd Smith, Provincial Minister for Children, Community and Social Services, visited Sunrise Therapeutic Riding and Learning Centre in Puslinch Township on July 30. The Minister was accompanied by Wellington-Halton Hills MPP, Ted Arnott, who extended the invitation to visit the centre.



The Minister toured the facility and reviewed the plans for a proposed residential/respite supportive affordable housing building for adults with developmental exceptionalities.

Also discussed were the proposed architectural plans for an expansion of the stables and barn buildings to provide much needed additional programming space.

The extra space will support not only the present waiting list for service, but also incorporate new and innovative teaching and life skills programs for future residents, adults enrolled in Sunrise's Life Skills day program and clients in the proposed Respite Program for adults 18 years and older.

JACK IRELAND BECOMES A SUNRISE AMBASSADOR

It is with great pleasure that we introduce rider Jack Ireland, as our newest Sunrise Ambassador. Jack is 15 years old and first came to Sunrise in 2013, when he had just turned eight years of age.

His mother Carrie Ann says about his first visit and assessment for horse riding, "He wanted to be there, but was tentative about getting on a horse. The volunteers and instructors were so welcoming, encouraging and understanding, that they took his stuffed dog Sonny for a ride first. It was the first place we went where Jack didn't have to fit into a box or do things a certain way in order to be part of the program."

Jack's favourite part of Sunrise is riding Toby, helping with grooming, and being involved in many events to help raise funds for Sunrise. His mother adds, "He looks forward to all things Sunrise." His grandmother Reggi Prior, is also a Sunrise volunteer and a great role model for Jack. For several years he joined her at the Aberfoyle Farmer's Market to help with a "Peaches and Cream" fundraiser generously initiated for Sunrise by market board members. Jack has willingly taken on many different tasks at Sunrise events, always staying to the end to help with clean up.



Regarding the impact of Sunrise on Jack's life his mother says, "Jack's mind and body were full of stress and anxiety. Riding Sunrise horses has helped him gain muscle tone, improve his balance, and help his eye strength, so that now he has better depth perception. We have seen a big increase in his confidence, and most of all it calms his mind and body. There were times due to weather, that his lesson had to be cancelled, but he was allowed to groom and help take care of the horses, and that really calmed him down after a long day at school." This young teenager has grown to become a strong and involved member of the Sunrise community. We look forward to working with him as our newest ambassador, and know that he will inspire other young riders to strive to reach their full potential. A quote from Jack: "Sunrise is the best, and makes me so happy. Riding Toby calms my brain down."
